Model A Mystery Oil

A number of years ago a couple of Model A guys I know decided to go to Las Vegas one weekend in their Model A's. They left from Orange County in Southern California in the wee hours of a Saturday morning and planned to stop at Barstow for gas. Not a good idea, best to refuel at the top of the Cajon Pass. Barstow is more than 100 miles away and there are some pretty steep grades to climb and it is a stretch even with the gas tank topped off. To compound the situation one of the guys was a Marvel Mystery oil addict. I have never been sure what you are supposed to do with this stuff, put it in the gas tank, put it in the engine oil, put a dab behind each ear, or drink a slug of it before breakfast each morning.

Later in the morning they came breezing into Barstow on fumes almost out of gas and pulled into a gas station to refuel. The first thing the Marvel Mystery oil addict did was dump a sizeable amount of Marvel Mystery oil in the gas tank before he began refueling. When they were finished they fired up their Model A's and continued the journey. About a hundred yards down the road the Marvel Mystery oil addict's car quit running and he drifted to the side of the road.

An immediate roadside seminar went into action. The first thing they did was replace the condenser, that's what you're always supposed to do, right? Since that didn't fix the problem they replaced the whole distributor. That didn't fix it either, so they replaced the coil to no avail. Next they decided to replace the spark plugs. When they removed the spark plugs they noticed an oily substance was coating the business end of each plug. It finally dawned on them that Marvel Mystery oil may be the culprit. They removed the drain plug from the bottom of the

carburetor and pure Marvel Mystery oil ran out.

The moral to the story is if you are going to put Marvel Mystery oil in your gas tank, don't do it when there is little or no gas in the tank as it will likely run down into the fuel line undiluted and allow you to travel only about a hundred yards before you run out of gas.




