LAST MONTH'S QUESTION?

I have a squeak issue. It seems to be coming from the motor compartment. When I start the engine there's a squeak like a loose fan belt.

I've checked the belt tension, lubed the generator bearings front and back, water pump (it's the new sealed type), front motor mounts, springs, nuts and bolts.

When I'm looking at the engine and leaning heavy on the left side fender the squeak stops or if I stand on the left running board it stops. If I sit behind the wheel or push in on the clutch sometimes it stops. When driving the car a while, it stops and doesn't come back until the next time I drive it.

QUESTION ANSWERS

No one had an answer for last month's question so my advice would be to go to the Gentlemen's Tech Talk on March 22nd and ask in person. Maybe even bring the car for a hands-on group diagnosis.

A NEW TOUR IS BREWING



Visalia can easily be reached in one day driving a Model A. It's only 184 miles from La Canada. If you go directly to Visalia and want to be there at the start, you will leave in the morning on Thursday, April 3.

The tour that I have planned will leave on Wednesday, April 2, from the McDonalds in LA Canada, at 8:30 AM. Our destination for the day will be Taft, CA. Taft is the home of the West Kern Oil Museum. 
